SPECIAL TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

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<u>APRIL 9, 1992</u>

A Special Meeting of the Wallingford Town Council was held on Thursday, April 9, 1992 in the Robert Earley Auditorium of the Wallingford Town Hall and called to Order at 6:35 P.M. by Chairperson Iris F. Papale. Answering present to the Roll called by Town Clerk Kathryn J. Wall were Councilors Doherty, Duryea, Killen, McDermott, Papale, Parisi & Zandri. Mayor William W. Dickinson, Jr. arrived at 6:40 P.M., Comptroller Thomas A. Myers was also present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given to the Flag.

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Ms. Papale announced that Mr. Holmes will arrive at approximately 7:30 P.M. and Mr. Solinsky was feeling ill but will make an attempt to attend.

ITEM #2 Consider and Approve a Transfer of Funds in the Amount of \$91,000 to Workmens Compensation Self-Insured Account.

Mr. Doherty read the entire transfer into the record as follows:

\$49,000 from Reserve Emergency Acct. Consolidated #001-8050-800-3190; \$20,000 from the Pension Plan Acct. #001-8020-800-8080; \$20,000 from Blue Cross Property Casualty Acct. #001-8041-800-8310 and \$2,000 from Acct. #001-8040-800-8250, Property Casualty Insurance - Gen. Gov't. for a total of \$91,000 into Acct. #001-8040-800-8350 - Workmens Compensation Self-Insured Acct.

Motion was made by Mr. Doherty, seconded by Mr. Parisi.

Mark Wilson, Risk Manager explained that these funds are needed to pay workmen's compensation expenses.

Mr. Zandri asked for an explanation as to why funds are being transferred from the Pension Plan?

Mr. Wilson stated that Mr. Seadale suggested using the excess funds.

Mr. Zandri asked the Mayor, why are we transferring from the Pension Plan?

Mayor Dickinson stated that it is not from the plan but rather a contribution to the plan which can vary according to what we expect in wage increases. There most likely was money that was remaining for payment of our contribution to the pension plan that was unnecessary due to wage rates coming in below or fewer employees requiring a lesser contribution. This is not money coming from the Pension Fund.

Mr. Zandri stated that the town has been playing "catch-up" in the budget to fully fund this plan and there should be other dollars available this year in other funds that could be transferred out of to stay on our plan to fully fund the pension. That is the only objection that he had.

Mayor Dickinson stated that the town is staying on the plan, this is money over and above that money for the year.

Mr. Myers explained that when the town budgets for the pension, it is budgeted on a certain percentage of the payroll. Last year's rate was 15% of payroll dollars. That includes all employees on the government side or enrolled in the plan and all the non-certified employees of the Board of Education. What happened this year is that there were several openings in the Police Department that did not get filled. The Board of Education cost has been running just slightly behind. The \$20,000 is due to open and unfilled positions where the position and

Mr. Killen asked Mr. Myers if he is aware that the transferring of dollars from other accounts during the last three years of the fiscal year is subject to referendum?

Mr. Myers was not aware of it.

Mr. Killen pointed out that they never have been but he and the Department of Law are disagreeing on the Mayor's veto power and under the literal translation the Council does not adopt the budget until certain things transpire. That translation could apply to the power to transfer within the last three months.

Mr. Myers stated that it has been done in the best and all transfers are resolutions.




