Attorney Small mentioned this Agreement had previously been approved earlier this year. Mr. Amwake explained a new Agreement was required due to one of the previous property owner's withdrawing.

Mr. Amwake then read a prepared document explaining the Agreement:

At the July 19, 2022 Public Utilities Commission meeting, the Commission voted to approve an Intermunicipal Agreement between the City of Meriden, the Town of Wallingford, Nancy M. Norke of 77 Midland Drive, and Brian and Brenda Monroe of 75 Midland Drive. At the August

16, 2022 Town Council meeting, the Council approved the Intermunicipal Agreement via Consent Agenda Item 3x.

Since the approval, the owners at 75 Midland Drive removed themselves from the agreement before it was signed by all parties. Therefore, in order for the owner of 77 Midland Drive to connect to the sanitary sewer system, a new Intermunicipal Agreement has been drawn up by an attorney working for Mrs. Norke. The proposed Intermunicipal Agreement is between the City of Meriden, the Town of Wallingford and Nancy M. Norke. The Intermunicipal Agreement has been reviewed by the City of Meriden, Wallingford Water and Sewer Division staff and the Wallingford Department of Law. All comments from each party involved have been addressed.

The Agreement is similar to the one previously approved, with the only changes being removal of the owners of 75 Midland Drive from the Agreement. In general, the Intermunicipal Agreement allows Mrs. Norke to connect to the private sanitary sewer lateral and become customers of the Meriden municipal sanitary sewer systems. The Intermunicipal Agreement also allows for the property to be connected to the Meriden municipal water system at some future time. There is no plan to connect the residence to the Meriden municipal water system at this time.

Councilor Fishbein asked if adversity could be replaced with hardship.

Councilor Marrone agrees with Councilor Tatta that we can't change now.

Mr. Brodinsky feels if we stay with current criteria for scoring, we won't get the results we need.

Bob Gross, Long Hill Road, feels changing questions after applicants have answered is not right.

Mike Glidden agrees with Councilors Marrone and Tatta that we cannot change criteria on this now.

Christy Dirk, 501C Wallingford, agrees we cannot change now.

Attorney Small clarified that she didn't state Committee wouldn't see financials, she agrees they need to.

Mr. Brodinsky spoke about an email in October between Law Dept., consultant and Committee that all financials and backup would be provided to Committee.

Councilor Zandri further explained his reason for motion (to close up loopholes). He feels it's a valid argument to not change now but wanted to make sure people who don't need it don't receive award.

Councilor Fishbein asked if the information on scoring criteria was provided to public.

Chairman Cervoni confirmed all financials will be provided to Committee.

















